

Primary School Sport's Funding

At Hallsville, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that having access to high quality P.E and sport PE has a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through maintaining our school sports partnership with Cumberland Secondary School. In addition to this we will use the funding to train our staff to deliver high-quality PE lessons; provide excellent sport based lunchtimes for the whole school; continue to enhance our extended school provision and employ a full-time P.E instructor.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years - here at Hallsville that will mean around £9,000 a year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.
